How can you use this story?

Get to know Swoosh and Glide

Swoosh and Glide are native sugar glider possums. They learn about the internet just like your children do.

Use their story to start a conversation with your children about online safety and how they can ask a

trusted adult for help if something doesn't feel right.

Talk about digital technology

Digital technology, such as smartphones, tablets, computers and TVs, is an important part of the world your children are growing up in. Help young children understand what makes it useful, but what can also pose risks.

Create your own rules

Rules can help young children build good habits around technology. Develop your own rules at home or in the early learning service with your children. Get inspired by the song that helps Swoosh and Glide to remember their rules.
